Below the definition of eligible membership from SVT's Tribal Enrollment Ordinance.

Section 6 ~ SVT Enrollment Ordinance: Any blood descendent of any person who was originally enrolled to the Native Village of Seldovia -under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

Environmental Department Updates



Seldovia Village Tribe's Environmental Office has worked on several projects with the Pratt Museum this summer. One of which was an exhibit panel about Gull Island that we hope to have done by the middle of August. We will have one panel here in Seldovia next to the gull cam monitor and one in Homer at the Pratt Museum next to their gull cam monitor. We were very fortunate to go with an elder from Nanwalek and his nephew to Gull Island and document the collection of Gull and Murre eggs.



EPA staff worked on the Jakolof Dumpsite Assessment with Shannon & Wilson, Inc. Geotechnical and Environmental Consultants the week of the July 16th. We are waiting now for the lab analysis to come back to tell us if there is any contamination on the site. We were able to put in permanent test well sites so we can go back and sample from those as money allows.



EPA staff continues to do air monitoring at mile 2 and 4. We had one community meeting with our project officer from ANTHC. This meeting had several members from the community that turned out to enjoy Fat Olives pizza and learn about our project.

A community meeting was held with the Kachemak Bay Research Reserve who came to Seldovia to talk about a clam monitoring project they are working on in Kachemak Bay. We will be part of the outreach team here in Seldovia. We only had a couple people turn out for this talk but they were very interested in the presentation and asked some good questions so there was good discussion. What they are looking at is PSP and Domoic Acid in the clams.



Tracie continues to collect the recyclables from the bins around town and keep track of weights collected. We also have a Recycling incentive program for kids and adults. For every bag of aluminum cans and plastics, #1 and #2, we give a coupon for a free kids cone at Perry's Café.
