Below is one of the definition of eligible membership from SVT's Tribal Enrollment Ordinance.

Section 6 Voting Membership: Any blood descendent of any person who was originally enrolled to the Native Village of Seldovia -under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. Adoption is another method of membership.



Jakolof Salmon Weir

The Environmental Department with funding from BIA is doing a adult salmon weir. We will be hiring two fisheries technicians who will work with current staff to man the weir each day to count adult returning Coho salmon, get age, sex and length, genetics and to see if it has a coded wire tag implanted in its head. We will be asking anyone harvesting Coho from the Jakolof area to let us scan the heads of their salmon so we can see if it has a tag. This weir will be in place till possibly the end of October. -Michael Opheim, Environmental Department




