SVT Scholarship Application Time



Environmental Department Update

SVT's Natural Resources Survey

In late 2018, Seldovia Village Tribe's Environmental Department sent out its biannual Natural Resources Survey. The survey has been done since 2004, and is used to help us understand the environmental priorities of our local community members. This in turn helps us determine our priorities for research projects, restoration and monitoring efforts, and other programs such as recycling and solid waste disposal.



It was no surprise that in 2018, salmon once again rose to the top of the priority list for research and monitoring in the 'fish' category. Halibut were right behind, and herring, Pacific cod, lingcod and black cod were highly-ranked as well. In terms of other marine species, clams and crab species were the top-ranked, but seaweed and octopus also scored very high. Moose were the highest-priority land mammal,

with goats and wolves tied for second place. Snowshoe hares, river otters and little brown bats came next.

In terms of birds, spruce grouse and birds of prey were the species people were most interested in, with ptarmigan, geese, diving birds and most duck species right behind.

We also asked people to prioritize a list of possible projects for our department to pursue (or in some cases, continue). Once again, salmon were the clear winners, with 'restore and research salmon populations and habitat' in a solid first place. Second was clam research and monitoring, following by contaminant testing of subsistence foods. Testing sediment and water chemistry was next, then

cleaning up litter at local beaches. The remaining projects that received fairly high rankings were continuing and expanding our regular and e-waste recycling programs, and invasive species removal.

Forty surveys were returned, 72.5% by mail and 27.5% online using SurveyMonkey, and each person who returned a survey by December 17, either by mail or online, was entered in a drawing for a \$50 Visa gift card. Norman Opheim and Dede Higman were the randomly-selected winners. Community input truly does guide the work that we do, and we appreciate that so many of you took the time to complete the survey!

Litnaugwiq Project

In October 2018, the Seldovia Village Tribe entered into a partnership with Ageya Wilderness Education, based in Homer, Alaska, to launch the Litnaugwiq Project. Funded by an Alaska Native Education Program Grant through the Department of Education, the Litnaugwiq Project is a student enrichment program that focuses on a cultural approach to Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). "Litnaugwiq" means "The Learning Place" in the Sugtestun language. The Litnaugwiq Project will provide a 24-day experiential STEM camp program for Alaska Native students entering ninth grade. Litnaugwiq Camp focuses on culture, native language, science, math and leadership to help prepare students for their transition into high school. Not only will Alaska Native students learn the tools available to excel in STEM subjects, they will also receive nine months of staff-guided coaching and peer supports to ensure long-term success as they navigate high school.

During camp, students will learn about natural history, gain an understanding of the role of math and science in their everyday lives, examine the unique marine environment of Kachemak Bay, and will actively work to build their wilderness skills. Students also gain exposure to careers in STEM fields by working with elders, researchers, and naturalists.

The Litnaugwiq Camp offers two, 24-day long camps during the summer for 32 students in each camp. It will serve 64 Alaska Native students entering ninth grade, providing a total of six camps over the 3-year grant period, serving a total of 192 participants. During the 2019 summer the camps will run from June 12th-July 5th & July 13th-August 5th.

This spring, the Litnaugwiq Project staff will be working to recruit students, secure camp materials, and finalize curriculum. If you have any questions or comments, please contact the Project Coordinator, Kate Hohman-Billmeier, (907) 435-3249 and she will be happy to speak with you!
